## Time to focus...

This week. Take stock. Pause to pray for yourself first. Bring yourself before the throne of God. At some point in your life you didn't know God, because you didn't know Jesus. Or you didn't know God as well as you do now, because you didn't know Jesus as well as you do know. You were not aware of the wonderful work of the Holy Spirit –how he counsels, brings peace and moves in your day to day life. What was life like before you knew Jesus? What made you follow Jesus?
